Gallup-McKinley County Schools

Beginning in 1999, the Gallup-McKinley County School System will have 20 elementary schools, six mid and junior schools and seven high schools. These facilities are located in ten communities situated throughout the nearly 5,500 square mile district (an area roughly the size of Delaware and Rhode Island combined). The two most distant schools are 100 highway miles apart. To serve its 14,440 students, the District hires 1,850 employees and utilizes 165 school buses. The student body is 85 percent Native American and 15% other. The pupil/teacher ratio is 20.5 to 1. The beginning salary for teachers is \$23,450, with a total payroll of approximately \$36 million. The Districts operational budget for 1998-99 was \$57,932,608.

Several County area schools received the prestigious Pinon Award for Commitment judged and awards by the Quality New Mexico using the Malcolm Baldrige Criteria. The New Mexico Awards Program is the home of the New Mexico Zia Quality Award and Roadrunner and Piñon Recognitions. This award and recognitions are presented to New Mexico organizations that demonstrate performance excellence, improvement, and a commitment to use quality concepts and principles

Rehoboth Christian School's mission is to celebrate diversity while equipping and challenging students to transform their world for Christ. Rehoboth Christian School was founded in 1903 by the Christian Reformed Church as a boarding school for Native American students and a ministry to the Native American peoples of the Four Corners region. A day school now, Rehoboth continues its ministry through education with multiculturalism as a backdrop, serving approximately 60% Native American students, 30% Anglo students, and 10% students of Hispanic descent and other ethnic minorities.

Rehoboth's student body is both ethnically and economically diverse. Approximately 30% of Rehoboth students come from very low-income and poverty-level families.

A Rehoboth education helps students develop confidence, competence, and compassion. Rehoboth is committed to building students up not only intellectually, but also spiritually and emotionally, helping them grow into mature Christians who approach the world with a healthy perspective and the skills necessary for living in it. Rehoboth teaches students to serve willingly, to appreciate the diversity of God's world, and to know the importance of achieving personal excellence for God's glory.

The purpose of St. Bonaventure School is to provide Navajo children from preschool through eighth grade with the educational tools necessary to enable them to make choices about the opportunities available to them, both locally and in the wider world. The Mission advocated education as the key to breaking the cycle of poverty. The staff of St. Bonaventure Indian Mission and School believe in preparing Navajo children for life-long education while respecting Navajo traditional roots. Dedicated, qualified, and caring teachers provide a positive and affirming learning environment. A full-time nurse, librarian, and counselor are also on campus to meet student needs.

The campus covers four acres and includes ten modular buildings which house all classrooms, a library, computer lab, gymnasium, cafeteria, nursing office, teacher's lounge, and the school office. The Outreach Thrift Store, Mission housing area, and the Maintenance and Administrative buildings are located a short distance away.

More than a third of Mission students are able to attend only because the Mission supplies transportation from their remote dwellings to and from school. St. Bonaventure uses a fleet of donated four-wheel drive buses, kept in safe and excellent working order by our mechanics, to traverse the treacherous roads in order to bring children to school.

School meals also are an important component of our Mission programs. St. Bonaventure provides breakfast and lunch to students. For many of the children the school breakfast and lunch may be their only meals of the day. The food service staff of local Navajos prepares more
